Flushing = increasing grain by 1-1.5lbs/day 4-6 weeks prior to breeding to one month post breeding

Shearing: once a year

Hooves: inspected/trimmed three times a year and should be inspected at the first sign of lameness. *Hooves will grow faster in damp/wet conditions.
